## Growth with People

- ▶ The leading organization in central Ohio job growth from 2001-2007, with more than 3,700 new jobs created. This represented nearly 50 percent of the region's employment gains according to the Columbus Chamber of Commerce.
- ▶ Named one of central Ohio's Best Places to Work by Columbus' *Business First* newspaper twice: 2007 and 2008. One of only five organizations in the "Large Company" category.

## Research Excellence

- ▶ From 2000-2007, total OSUMC research funding increased by more than \$100 million (\$80.5 million to \$188.7 million); NIH funding increased from \$58.9 million to \$113.4 million
- ▶ \$34 million NIH Clinical and Translational Science Award in May 2008 establishes Ohio State as one

of only 38 members of a national consortium that speeds the translation of scientific discovery into better patient care

- ▶ Ranked 21st by National Science Foundation in medical sciences for FY 2006, up from 25th in FY 2005
- ▶ OSU is one of only 40 National Cancer Institute-designated comprehensive cancer centers in the United States
- ▶ OSUMC houses or co-manages more than 20 research centers and institutes and 25 core research laboratories, plus one affiliated research core lab
- ▶ Received \$55.3 million in multiyear Third Frontier research grants from state of Ohio
- ▶ More than 2,000 active clinical trials in virtually every medical specialty

## Education Excellence

- ▶ Ranked 30th by *U.S. News & World Report*; 12th among public medical schools; a gain of 14 positions since 2003
- ▶ Ohio State's College of Medicine received more than 4,400 applications for its 2008 entering medical class of 210 students; 9 percent acceptance

rate; 52 percent matriculation rate; 10th largest medical student enrollment in U.S.

- ▶ One of the few universities in the world to offer five dual medical degrees: MD/PhD (Medical Scientist); MD/MBA (Business Administration); MD/JD (Law); MD/MHA (Health Administration); MD/MPH (Public Health)
- ▶ School of Allied Medical Professions: More than 1,800 students in nine undergraduate and five graduate programs ranging from athletic training and circulation technology to medical dietetics, radiological sciences, respiratory and physical therapy
- ▶ School of Biomedical Science: Training for biomedical research careers in fields ranging from anatomy and biomedical informatics to molecular and cellular biochemistry, virology, neuroscience, cell biology and pharmacology
- ▶ More than 500 residents and fellows train in more than 60 graduate and residency programs each year
- ▶ More than 13,000 College of Medicine M.D. and residency program graduates practice in all 50 states and in more than 30 countries
- ▶ More than 17,000 physicians and hospitals in more than 90 countries subscribe to our Web-based continuing medical education training programs annually.

## Patient Care Excellence

- ▶ Ohio State's James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute is one of 50 U.S. hospitals named to Leapfrog's list of "Top Hospitals" for quality and safety
- ▶ Anthem Quality Program Award 2007-08
- ▶ Ranked among top 15 in University HealthSystem Consortium Quality & Accountability Award
- ▶ 16th consecutive year named one of "America's Best Hospital's" by *U.S. News & World Report* - eight specialties ranked in 2008
- ▶ One of only eight medical centers in the country named to *Hospitals & Health Networks* magazine's list of America's "Most Wired" Hospitals nine times
- ▶ First hospital in central Ohio to achieve Magnet status for nursing excellence
- ▶ Record operating revenue and income in FY 2007 and FY 2008
- ▶ With FY 2008 operating revenue of \$2.15 billion, OSU Medical Center is virtually self-sustaining financially and represents 52.6 percent of University revenue
- ▶ OSU Medical Center hospitals statistics (FY 2008)

OSU Medical Center is a national leader in developing personalized health care, a new form of health care delivery based on each individual's unique biology, behavior and environment. Ohio State experts in biomedical informatics, genetics, pharmacology and specialties as diverse as cancer and wound healing are joining forces to apply discoveries in this new field directly to patient care and disease prevention.

## ProjectOne

- ▶ ProjectONE, the largest facilities growth and expansion project in The Ohio State University's history is now underway and will improve lives by advancing personalized health care.
- ▶ An unprecedented \$1.3 billion in new construction and renovation of Medical Center and Health Sciences facilities will take place between now and 2015.
- ▶ The project includes construction of a new cancer hospital and critical care tower, an outpatient clinic, research facilities and additional parking and classrooms.
- ▶ Renovations of existing buildings are also included in the project.
