



If you have an injury to your head and are unsure if you have a concussion, here are some signs to watch for:

- Headache
- Dizziness or balance problems
- Feeling dazed, foggy or stunned
- Fatigue
- Memory problems
- Slurred speech
- Trouble concentrating
- Irritability or emotional changes
- Nausea
- Vision problems
