## Do you have Heart Failure?

Researchers at Ohio State's Richard M. Ross Heart Hospital are conducting several clinical research studies to determine if investigational treatment options for heart failure are as safe and effective as the current treatments. Our studies examine different aspects of heart failure treatment which include a wide range of treatments from drug therapy, exercise and lifestyle improvement, to more invasive treatments such as pace-makers.

You may be eligible to participate in these studies if you:

- Are 18 years or older
- Have a diagnosis of heart failure
- Are seeking treatment

There are currently several different studies focusing on treatment of heart failure. Participating in a heart failure study may result in some of your research-related treatment being paid for by the study sponsor. You may be compensated for your time while participating. These studies last for different amounts of time, ranging from less than one year to five years.
